# Summer Sunday School Opportunities

9:30 a.m. Each Sunday

Sunday School for all ages continues through the summer with a change of pace-- and great studies!

Preschool (room 212)—Carolyn Brown will lead our youngest ones in seeing video-based Bible stories from the Jesus Story-book Bible. The children love these!

Elementary class (room 101)--Children who have completed K-5 join together to “Grow in Grace and Gratitude”. The Building Use Committee would like to report that our new building is being well "used". In a space of ten days last month it hosted a funeral reception for Ben Barkley, a reception for the McElwaine's, four evenings of Vacation Bible School for over 125 children, youth and adults, a well attended adult education report on the 222nd GA, provided overnight lodging for a group of youth from Coastal Carolina Presbytery who were traveling with our GOOTH on a bus to Triennium at Purdue University and had a dinner before a musical performance of a touring singing group from California Baptist University. Whew!

CPC should be very pleased that your foresight and dedication to provide such a facility for both internal and external users is indeed being well appreciated. Thank you for your continuing support of the Building Fund as we continue to support God's work in our community and beyond.





What a privilege it was to have California Baptist University come all the way from California to perform for us in our sanctuary. Thank you to all involved, and to all that came out to support the group in their concert.

Coming up in March of next year, our congregation has the opportunity to host my alma mater, Westminster Choir College, as their sophomore class does their yearly tour to the southern states. Their tour will be very much like that of California Baptist University's tour, in that they will arrive the day of the concert, fellowship with us in a prepared meal, perform in our sanctuary, and go home with members of our congregation following the concert until they depart the next morning. The major difference between the two is the size of the group, and that's where your help is needed.

There are 70 students that will need a warm bed following the concert, meaning we will need many homestays for the students. Even though March is pretty far down the road, Westminster needs to know by the end of August if we are able to host the group. Please let me, Brittany, know if you are willing to take 2, 3, 4, or however many your guest rooms will allow by August 15th.
