Mission Highlights



Christmas Eve Offering SECU Family House of Winston-Salem

The Mission Committee (with Session approval) has selected SECU Family House of Winston-Salem to receive our Christmas Eve offerings from both evening services. For adult patients and caregivers traveling to Forsyth County for healthcare, SECU Family House is a compassionate, comfortable alternative to a hospital waiting room or an expensive hotel as they face the challenge of out-of-town medical care. In addition to housing, transportation to the two major hospitals, and often an evening meal provided by volunteer groups, the Family House has a beautiful "common" kitchen that families can use to prepare breakfast and even lunches and snacks (think peanut butter sandwiches) to take with them to the hospital for the day.

In 2015, knowing how important breakfast is for these families, the Family House created a Milk Money fund specifically to purchase coffee, milk, eggs, creamer, as well as last minute meal purchases if needed for dinner. Today, volunteers go on weekly grocery runs with money from this fund to purchase these items to keep the kitchen supplied.

\$25 will fill the kitchen fridge with milk and eggs for one week. \$100 will fill it for two weeks. It takes \$300 to take care of the coffee needed for one month. With your help, Clemmons Presbyterian can fill the fridge and coffee pantry for many months during 2018.



Let me know if you have any questions.



A Note From Patrick McElwaine

“All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.” 2 Tim. 3:16-17

All scripture is inspired by God. This word inspired literally means “God-breathed.” God breathed in Genesis and brought life to humans. God breathed in Acts and brought life to the church. Paul tells Timothy that God in a similar way breathed life into scripture. God revealed the divine self in written words that point to the eternal Word, Jesus Christ.

But that doesn’t mean we always understand God’s word to us in scripture. That’s why we pray together the Prayer for Illumination before reading scripture in worship. We pray for the Holy Spirit’s support and guidance in understanding what scripture has to say.

As we seek to listen faithfully for God’s word to us in scripture, *The Westminster Confession of Faith* offers a sage perspective on interpretation:

“The infallible rule of interpretation of Scripture, is the Scripture itself; and therefore, when there is a question about the true and full sense of any scripture (which is not manifold, but one), it may be searched and known by other places that speak more clearly.” (6.009)

In an age of cherry picked verses and pithy social media posts, measuring scripture against scripture is more important than ever. How does one verse or passage compare to the grand narrative of God and God’s people told in the Bible? How does scripture speak to itself and reveal a cohesive understanding of God therein? May we approach scripture with humble and open hearts, seeking God’s word and will rather than our own.
