Grace and Peace in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! It is hard to believe that February marks the start of Lent this year. Ash Wednesday on February 14th initiates the season as we mark ourselves with ashes. We also point to the theological reality of how the sin and the brokenness of the world resulting from the Fall disfigures us who are created in God's image. We are reminded of our loving Creator who formed us out of clay and molded us out of ashes whose sovereign hand sustains and guides all the days and seasons of our lives until they come to fruition, and we profess "our baptism is now complete in death." We return to ashes.

"From ashes you have come and to ashes you return." Don't miss the Ash Wednesday service on Valentine's Day following the Wednesday night dinner. This season we will continue to explore the themes of impermanence and transformation as we explore the story of Peter. The staff has chosen the Sanctified Art curriculum called "A Wandering Heart: Figuring Out Faith with Peter." As we follow the trajectory of Peter's relationship with Jesus Christ and witness his transformation from a fisherman to a "fisher of people," to one who walks on water, to one who recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, we see someone who grows and evolves in their faith. Someone who is human and has lapses in judgment.

Peter at times succumbs to his own fear and obscures living into the highest intentions God is calling humanity to. And yet, through it all, God uses broken things and imperfect people to bring the story of God's salvation and life-giving love to fruition in the universe.

Peter is a stand-in for any of us who have followed Jesus- doubted, betrayed God and our highest ideals, yet found redemption, life-giving hope, grave-shattering transcendence, and ultimate renewal. Writing on this series, Rev. Lauren Wright Pittman, one of the founding creative partners for a Sanctified Art says, "I want to be present like Peter- to orient my life towards God's will, to ask for help when I'm sinking, to celebrate moments of clarity, to pause when I'm not quite getting it, to be open to learning and redirection, to receive gifts with humility, to acknowledge devastating missteps to repent, to run toward hope, and to feel the freedom that is found in abundant, astounding grace. At the end of the journey, I don't want to be perfect. I just want to be able to say that I loved, and that I loved well."

We will follow Peter's journey as we follow the eclipses of God's grace, and we will pair the trajectory of Peter's story with the words of "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

My hope is by the time we reach an empty tomb on Easter Sunday, we will sing these words as our own:

O to grace how great a debtor daily I'm constrained to be!

Let that grace now, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to thee.

Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, prone to leave the God I love;

Here's my heart; O take and seal it; seal it for thy courts above.

This **Lent**, we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. By following Peter's journey, we watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a very normal human trying to figure it all out—just like us.

As we were studying Peter's faith journey, the lyrics of "Come Thou Fount" came to mind. It's as if Peter himself wrote this song. Like many of us, Peter has a wandering heart. His journey is not polished, or linear, or perfect, but he is always tethered to the love of God.

In this series, we want to affirm that faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. We want to affirm the ways Peter keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people—in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

This Lent, we will look for ourselves in the stepping stones of Peter's story. We will reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys as well as who and what has shaped us along the way. As we wander, let us tune our hearts to sing God's grace. May we rest in streams of mercy, never ceasing.


Lent Devotional Books


This year we are offering two options in devotional books.
