Dear Friends,

Pentecost is an ancient Jewish celebration that caused Jerusalem to be unusually filled the year of Jesus' resurrection. The power of God's Holy Spirit filled the Apostles and people heard the good news of Christ in their own languages, moving many to believe.

The Presbyterian Church uses the Pentecost offering among churches across our country to support the work of faith development among youth and young adults. One of the projects this offering supports is the Youth Triennium at Purdue University. Every three years thousands of teens gather for days and nights filled with worship, learning and fellowship. CPC has been sending young people for the past four trienniums and every time they come back with stories of great and inspiring experiences with fellow Presbyterian Christians from all across the country.

Another use of the Pentecost offering is the Young Adult Volunteer program (YAV). This has become dear to our corporate CPC heart as three of our own have given a year of their lives to adult volunteer service and ministry. Jennifer Ring's year was in Los Angeles. Katie Morris' year was in Nashville and Kelly Norris is currently serving her year in Austin Texas. This is an inspiring program with many graduates living out lives of service in their local congregations or being called to dedicated church service.

Congregations can keep 40% of the Pentecost offering for local work with youth and children in need. Your Session has approved to set aside money from our contributions to provide for summer enrichment opportunities for the children of our refugee family from Eritrea. These boys are picking up English quickly and are good students and participating in summer activities will help them continue their growth as new Americans.

The Mission Committee is sharing information about the refugee effort through the new "CPC Mission Blog" accessed through our church website. Every few weeks there will be new articles and pictures about mission work our congregation supports or missions in which our people are involved. I hope you will read it and share the link on your own social media platforms.

Finally, you might read about a CPC member and think "I don't think I remember who that is." If you participate in the new photo directory – you will know them and they will know you – BY NAME! There are still appointment times available, either through the church website or by calling the church office. When your picture is included you will receive this and future updated directories with updated contact information.

As we move into the summer months, please don't be a stranger and worship here whenever you can, and worship wherever you are on the Lord's day. The New Testament book of Hebrews says "do not give up assembling together." And if you see something good in another church, bring me a copy – no good church idea should go unstolen!




Join us for Summer Sunday School beginning June 11!

The Present Word is a popular adult quarterly Bible curriculum. Through the exploration of biblical text, adult study groups are invited into a deepened relationship with God. The Present Word engages participants in an experiential style of learning-connecting faith and life. Each session is carefully outlined in the Leader's Guide with a description of materials needed for the lesson. **Summer 2017 Theme: God's Urgent Call** From the days of the judges to the prophets to the early church leaders, God called and the faithful answered.

Addressing such questions as "Are You Saved, or Are You Presbyterian?" and "Is the Bible the Literal Word of God or Just a Long, Boring Book?" this is an easy-to-understand, slightly irreverent approach to theology and the kind of theological musings that many youth and others have today. *Being Presbyterian in the Bible Belt Today* helps Presbyterian young people articulate their faith and respond to these questions from a mainline point of view.

The Children will be *Growing in Grace & Gratitude*, a study that "is rooted in the foundation of Presbyterian identity where God's grace and our gratitude are the heartbeat of our faith, life, and worship". Children will be inspired to learn and practice hospitality, generosity, and love; They will be encouraged to live their lives as an expression of God's grace. Children will meet in groups of preschool age (3-5 years), kindergarten - 2nd grade, and 3rd - 5th grade.

This is also true from a spiritual perspective, since the Spirit brings the church into existence and enlivens it. Thus Pentecost is the church's birthday.
