Dear Friends,

A few years ago I told you about Felicia Stewart Hoyle's "40 bags in 40 days" project. I think she found it on some Christian Educator's website. Now it is big on the internet, from religious and non-religious sources. Essentially for the 40 days of Lent (Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday, omitting Sundays) you would remove one bag of "stuff" from your house, reducing clutter and sharing with others (or the recycling bin.)

This is the best analogy I know for the season of Lent. Lent is not mentioned in the Bible. It is not a church requirement. It is not even an essential tenet. But for well over a thousand years Christians have recognized that Christ's sacrifice on the cross and resurrection from the dead is so important and meaningful that we should make a dedicated effort to get ready to observe it. It could even be a time to focus on decluttering your heart to make more room for Christ.



Some say that we should make this effort every day, and we should. I also should have no clutter in my house. I know the golf stuff I will never use, hats I will never wear, books I will never read or read again, and much more. I know I should go through that stuff regularly if not daily and get most of it out of my life so it won't weigh me down and someone else can use it. I know it, I just don't do it.

Some Reformers criticized Lent for the slavish idea that observing Lent would lead to salvation or earn more blessings or forgive more sins. Those were, and are, terribly wrong ideas. Can a specific, time limited period help you achieve a long sought goal or ingrain a devotional or other desired practice? Most certainly. These 40 days can be a time to clear your closet, and elsewhere, as well as reorient your heart, or they can be just 40 days, and God will still love you.

I can't end without thanking our young people and their leaders for a tremendous Youth Sunday. It was a great time of worship and we thank you. Thanks too to the more than 50 volunteers who worked to host the meeting of Salem Presbytery here last week. It was among the smoothest and best organized and executed all day meetings I have witnessed since coming to Salem in 2001.


## Wednesdays in Lent March 4 – April 8





5. For what specific tasks, assignments, and program areas will this person have responsibility?

When you see your Vision Team, please thank them for serving as your representatives on this holy effort. You will be hearing much more from them in the near future; they will be most grateful for your thoughts and input. ## 2020 Mission Trip to Chiapas, Mexico

You are invited to attend a mission trip to Chiapas, Mexico, July 11-19, 2020. Ostensibly, our mission is to work on a construction project requested by the Tselal people, an indigenous people of Mexico, and to conduct a 3 day children's Bible School. The construction work you do is based your ability. Our true mission is building relationships. First is our relationship with Jesus Christ. Few people have returned from Chiapas without having been profoundly affected and without recognition of a much deeper personal faith. The second relationship is the one we have with our fellow mission travelers. The shared experience with people we may have only recognized in church often becomes a friendship lasting long after we return to Clemmons. Finally is our relationship with the Presbyterian Tselal people. By working, eating, worshipping with, and living near the people of a Tselal village, we begin to see Christ in people who do not look like us, or live like us, or speak our language. Instead, we recognize them as our brothers and sisters in Christ. Your cost is the cost of the airfare plus out of pocket spending money. Some generous church members are providing additional funds to cut the costs for a participant(s). Youth, young adults in their 20's and 30's, single individuals, and families are invited to come. 
## Personnel


