





A Note From Patrick McElwaine

Dear friends,

Hallelujah, He is risen! Through the contemplative days of Lent, the abandonment and terror of Holy Week, and beyond the empty tomb we have come. The Easter season renews us with the hope filled power of resurrection – not only as a historical event frozen in the past, or as an ethereal future possibility, but rather as the sovereign God at work in the world right now. Author H.A. Williams describes the present implication of Christ's resurrection well in his book "True Resurrection":

When we begin to recognize the power of resurrection present in the ordinary gritty routine of our daily lives, then we shall see for ourselves that all that separates and injures and destroys is being overcome by what unites and heals and creates. We shall no longer have to ask where and when this happens, for we shall have first-hand experience of it as we live as ordinary folk in the ordinary world.

As God's beloved children, we certainly look forward to the life eternal with our maker beyond this physical life. But, because of Christ's resurrection, our hearts are also tuned to experience God's resurrecting power here and now. Jesus' bodily resurrection sets the pattern for us to look for and expect resurrection everywhere, even in the "ordinary gritty routine of our daily lives."

Addictions overcome. Strained relationships restored. Physical maladies healed. Hard hearts opened to love again. Losses of all kinds borne and redeemed through the balm of God's grace. The Lord of Life is at work even here and now – may we have eyes to see and faith to believe.


