### **Ten Thousand Villages Sale at Clemmons Presbyterian**

Mark your calendars for **Sunday morning, November 5**, when the Mission Committee will sponsor an onsite store at Clemmons Presbyterian with merchandise available for purchase from Greensboro's Ten Thousand Villages Shop.

For 70 years, Ten Thousand Villages has been cultivating trading relationships in which artisans in developing countries receive a fair price for their work and consumers have access to distinctive handcrafted items. The organization has established long-term buying relationships in places where skilled artisans are under- or unemployed, and in which they lack other opportunities for income. As a founding member of the World Fair Trade Organization (WFTO), Ten Thousand Villages sees fair trade as an alternative approach to conventional international trade.

Originally, a few women from First Presbyterian in Greensboro set up a local retail shop and began staffing it with a group of volunteers as part of their mission focus on fair trade. One of their outreach programs is to bring the most popular items from the store to other venues, such as our Church Fellowship Hall for our holiday shopping convenience. So make your shopping lists and be prepared to support fair trade with beautiful gifts and holiday décor for a great cause! **November 3<sup>rd</sup> - 4<sup>th</sup>**





## *Finance*

CPC is an active church providing worship, education and service to the Clemmons community and across the globe. I have been blessed over the past year to have been Moderator of the Finance Committee, and as we move into the 4th quarter of 2017, I would like to give you an overview of our church finances.


First, our committees have done a great job doing God's work that was planned for 2017. Through the first three quarters of the year, 70.5% of the budget has been used (\$439,338 of \$623,052) and barring unplanned emergencies or cost increases for fuel, etc., this year's expenses should wrap up within budget.

And second, through September, 66.4% of the \$594,864 pledged has been received. Here we are behind; however, historically gifts increase during the Thanksgiving and Christmas season as members catch up on pledges and offerings are received from new members and visitors. With the same increase as we experienced last year, it is anticipated that the 2017 stewardship goal will also be met.

In November, you will receive a church statement of your giving through September 30th to help with yearend planning. After you review this, please let Inessa or myself know if you find any errors.


