Worship at CPC

Worship at Clemmons Presbyterian is an opportunity to express and explore Christian faith as we offer praise to God. People of God of all ages gather here to pray, sing, hear the Word of God read and preached and share our faith. Families and individuals join to form one worshipping community of faith as we celebrate the sacraments of the Lord's Supper (Communion) and Baptism. We celebrate the Lord's Supper the first Sunday of each month and at other special services like Maundy Thursday. We baptize both children and adults when the occasion arises, always during the regular hours of worship. Sometimes our worship features liturgical dancers, dramatic readings, children's choirs, hand bells, children's hand chimes, our ensemble of musicians and other special events.

Children of all ages are welcome to be with us for the entire worship service; however, a nursery for preschoolers is provided in our 200 building. The Parlor room is available for parents to take their child and still be able to hear and see worship. Parents may choose to take preschoolers (ages 4 and under) to the nursery following the Time for Children. The door to the preschool suite is locked during services. Just ring the doorbell.

Childcare is provided during both worship services on Sunday mornings as well as during the Sunday school hour for children birth through 3 years old.

Children's Worship Bags and Booster Seats are available for children (preschool-elementary) to use during the worship service. They are by the coat rack in the hall. Our ushers may also assist you.

Kid's Worship is for children ages 4 through 2nd grade. Following "Time for Children," in our 10:45 am worship service, the children will be accompanied to Room 211 where they will participate in this exciting "hands-on" program. All parents should meet their children in the classroom following the worship service.

Study at CPC

SUNDAY SCHOOL: Sundays, 9:30 AM

Intergenerational Class: Old Fellowship Hall (100 building)

This class is for children 4 yrs. – 5th grade as well as their parents and any other young at hearts who want to learn the Bible stories. Each class includes gathering, Studying, Playing, Praying and Breaking Bread.

Middle School Youth: room 105

This class is for youth, grades 6th – 8th. They will be studying scripture, using the *Feasting on the Word Youth* curriculum. *Feasting on the Word* materials provide opportunities for this age group to explore their personal and communal identity in Jesus Christ through meaningful community-building experiences, engaging Bible study, and relevant learning activities. Biblical stories will come alive in new and creative ways. In response to God’s amazing, unconditional love, youth will be challenged to put their faith into action as they grow to understand themselves as Christ’s disciples. Each session includes a media connection section that ties the week’s Scripture passage to a film, song, or website.

Senior High Youth: GOOTH room (room 108)

This class is for youth, grades 9th-12th. Using the *Faith Questions* curriculum, The young people will be encouraged to look to Scripture and our faith tradition in relevant, responsive ways. Each 4-6 week study is based on questions posed by older youth from around the PC (USA). The titles of the Fall studies are *God, Jesus Christ, Holy Spirit and Christianity and ...*

Adult Bible Study: room 206

This class is for adults of all ages and stages. The class uses the *Present Word* curriculum. This Fall the study, *Responding to God’s Grace*, explores what it means to live in the grace of God and perceive God’s grace all around. As 2 Peter 3:18 counsels, “grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory.”

Seeds of Faith: room 301c

This class is for adults of all ages and stages. Using the curriculum, *Six Theme Everyone Should Know*, the class will start the Fall discussing the 6 Themes of *The Bible*. In this study, the participants will look at six themes that begin in the early chapters of Genesis, span the pages of Scripture, and end with the glorious vision of the book of Revelation.

Women's Bible Study: Thursdays, 10:00 am; room 301c

This study is for women of all ages. The group will start the Fall with the study, *Fierce*, by Jennifer Cowart. In this study, participants will look at lesser-known female characters in the Bible and the ways they changed the world by living into God's calling, including:

- The midwives of Egypt (Shiphrah and Puah), who made hard decisions in the face of evil
- Deborah, who was an unlikely and powerful leader
- Naaman's slave girl, who bravely points others to God's healing power
- The Woman at the Well, who boldly repented and shared her faith
- Lois and Eunice, who parented with intentionality and effectiveness
- Dorcas, who showed kindness to those in need.

The group will explore their lives, will discover how they too can live into their callings, honor the Lord, and even change the world through their courage, faithfulness, and obedience.

Adult Bible Study: Wednesdays, 7:00 pm, 9/11, 9/18, 9/25; room 301c
Wednesdays in September there will be a study for adults called *A Light to My Path: Interpreting Scripture as Reformed Christians*. This three-part video series explores what it means for Reformed Christians to read and interpret the Bible as Scripture, as the Word of God. "Scripture holds a decisive place in our shared identity as Reformed Christians. While we value our theological traditions and our polity, Scripture always has the final authoritative word on our faith and life. We do not look to Scripture because it is a common or "traditional" thing to do, or because the church has given it authority. In the words of the Belgic Confession, we believe the teachings of Scripture "because the Holy Spirit testifies in our hearts that they are from God, and also because they prove themselves to be from God" (article 5)."
