You may see her around this academic year while she works at the University as part of the Presidential Fellowship she received at graduation.

We traveled over to Nashville as total tourists though I told Katie Morris that I was inspecting Vanderbilt Divinity School to see if it was good enough for her - and it passed and she will too! I was able to read several books on pastoral ministry and church life. 
It's Time to Sign Up for Fall Bread Breakers


